POPE FRANCIS ENCYCLICAL ON THE ENVIRONMENT

Released on June 18, 2015, Pope Francis's encyclical, *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home*, highlights several basic teachings. First, the destruction of God's creation, and specifically climate change, is a moral issue. Second, there is an integral connection between our destruction of "Mother Earth" and the suffering of the poor, especially those in developing countries. Finally, immediate actions are required, by individuals, who must change their lives, and by the community of nations.
