It has become a popular devotion to bless animals near the feast of St. Francis of Assisi (4 October) and impart God's protection upon them. All creatures great and small, along with their owners, are welcome!

OCTOBER: MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY



The association of the Rosary with the month of October began with Pope Leo XIII, who wrote in an encyclical letter in 1883, "we also desire that the whole of the month of October in this year should be consecrated to the Holy Queen of the Rosary" (On Devotion of

the Rosary, no. 8, 1 September 1883). Pope Leo followed up on this initial decree with eighteen more encyclicals calling for recitation of the Rosary by the faithful throughout the month of October.

In his October 2002 Apostolic Letter *On the Most Holy Rosary*, St. John Paul II proclaimed October 2002 through October 2003 as the "Year of the Rosary", marking the 120th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's first Rosary encyclical.

The Rosary is a scripture-based prayer that begins with the Apostles' Creed, a summary of the great mysteries of the Catholic faith. The Our Father, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the Hail Mary is the Angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary. St. Pius V officially added the second part of the Hail Mary.

Traditionally, the four sets of mysteries: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous, are meditated on specific days of the week. The Joyful Mysteries are recited on Mondays and Saturdays; the Luminous Mysteries on Thursdays; the Sorrowful Mysteries on Tuesdays and Fridays; and the Glorious Mysteries on Wednesdays and Sundays.

Parishioners pray the Rosary every Sunday, after the 9:00 a.m. Mass at Our Saviour and the 12:45 p.m. Mass at Sacred Hearts, and on weekdays after the 5:15 p.m. Mass at Sacred Hearts. All are welcome to join them and offer to Our Lady your intentions.
