Stewardship



Whose World?

Traditionally, a steward is a highly trusted manager of a household, a farm, or a landed estate: a

person who has responsibility for many things and is expected to act independently and ably without the need for micromanaging from the owner. Today's second reading says that a steward must be trustworthy, yet however well a steward does his job and for however many years, he never becomes the owner of what he manages. You may believe that you own a lot of things: a house and its contents, a car, computer, cell phone, land or property, a business, stocks, and mutual funds. Do you really own any of it? If you did, you could take it with you when you die. The value of anything you "own" is only as good as the value others ascribe to it. What would happen if you started looking at things, not as something to "own" but instead as things to "steward"? Think about the implications of this. If you stopped focusing on "ownership" and instead thought "stewardship," would you:

cling less tightly to things?

- begin to think about who else can benefit from "your" stuff?
- think more about other people before yourself?
- consider future generations and how you might benefit them?

The change of attitude from ownership to stewardship seems small, but if you form it into a habit it can change your thoughts, words, and actions in ways you least expect. Start by saying, "Everything that belongs to me, I will try to feel I no longer own; rather, I am *responsible* for it. My stuff. My relationships. My potential." The true owner and the one who judges is the Lord. God brings to light what is hidden and knows the motives of your heart. Whose world is this after all?

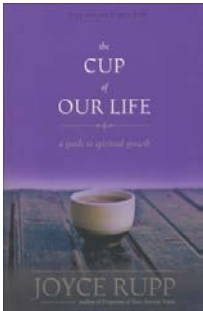


Weekly Parish Offering

Fasting and Abstinence for Catholics in the U.S.

During Lent, Catholics in the United States **abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. They fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**

To **abstain from meat** on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent means to not eat meat on those days. It does not intend the omission of eggs or dairy products.

The **required fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday involves eating only one full meal on those days. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. The required fast does not allow eating anything between meals. "

*All Catholics who have **completed their fourteenth year** are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the **beginning of their sixtieth year.***

Nevertheless, pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance. - Code of Canon Law, #1252

Twenty Catechumens and three Candidates will be celebrating the Rite of Sending at our 10:30 Mass on **March 5**, and the Rite of Election where they are presented to the Bishop at St. Joseph Church in Placentia on **Monday, March 6**. What Was Happening in the Twelfth Century?

St. Bernard of Clairvaux had a friend in Germany whose name was Norbert of Xanten, and it was through Norbert that Bernard acquired the support of the German bishops in the schism forming around the dual claims to the papacy by Innocent II and Anacletus, which ended in the affirmation of Innocent and the excommunication of Anacletus.

Norbert was born around 1080 in the Cologne Diocese of the Holy Roman Empire. His parents were of high nobility, his father, Heribert Count of Genepur was related to the Holy Roman Emperor. Coming from such a wealthy and highly connected family, Norbert received excellent education. He became a vain and irresponsible young adult, living in the moment with plenty of money to support his whims. Although he was encouraged to become a priest, he declined, choosing only to be ordained to the minor order of sub deacon whose only responsibility was to chant the Divine Office at the local church. However, he failed to keep even this obligation, paying someone to take his place, and left for Cologne where he became a counselor in the court of Emperor Henry V. While in Cologne, Norbert was again offered priesthood,

and even an appointment to be Bishop of Cambrai offered in 1113. He declined.

In 1115, Norbert was riding his horses through a wooded area near Cologne when a sudden storm came up. A lightning bolt startled the horse into throwing his rider to the ground, where Norbert lay unconscious for an hour in the drenching rain. When he regained consciousness, he recognized how close to death he had come, and prayed to be saved from the storm, promising that he would devote his life to God. He survived the accident and returned to his home where he began studies for the priesthood under the direction of Abbot Como of Sigeberg, being ordained later that year. He used his wealth to establish a monastery Furstenberg and with a generous allotment of property, deeded it to Abbot Como and his Benedictine successors.

Norbert appealed to the pope for permission to preach, which was granted. He adopted an extreme asceticism, as he traveled throughout Europe as an itinerant preacher. Three of his companions died from the extreme penitential lifestyle and exposure to the freezing weather. The clergy in Germany felt that Norbert's asceticism was too extreme, and he was denounced at the Council of Fritzlar in 1118. In response, Norbert sold his remaining property and gave the proceeds to the poor. He continued his travels and preaching during which time he came to the abbeys of Citeaux and Clairvaux where he met St. Bernard, and was impressed with the rule and structure of the Clairvaux monasteries.

In 1119 Pope Calixtus commissioned Norbert to found a monastery in the Diocese of Laon, France. Norbert searched for the right location and settled on a cruciform valley called Premontre. On Christmas Day, 1120, he founded the Canons Regular of Premontre with thirteen companions. By the following year, the Order had grown to forty canons. Norbert chose to base his order on the Rule of Augustine, rather than Benedict, which allowed more freedom to move from place to place and preach outside of a monastic confinement. To this he added many of the administrative features of the Clairvaux monastery that Bernard had developed.

Norbert would go on to establish monasteries in Germany, Belgium, France, and Transylvania. He also established the first tertiary, or third order, designed for lay persons who wished to share in the spirituality of the order. He became a powerful churchman, and in 1126 Pope Honorius II appointed him Archbishop of Magdeberg. Appalled by the laxity of the clergy in his new diocese, Norbert tried to impose some of the discipline of Premontre, which created enemies for him. Three violent attempts were made to take his life, but each time he was defended by his supporters.

Norbert died of natural causes at age 54 in 1134, and was canonized by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582. His body was moved to Prague, where it remains, in 1627. Norbert's order, the Premonstratensian Canons (also called the Norbertines), have spread throughout the entire world.

Un buen administrador es una persona responsable—hombre

o mujer—en la cual se puede confiar y de quien se puede depender sin necesidad de que el dueño tenga que estar asesorándole a cada paso. La segunda lectura de hoy dice que un administrador debe ser fiel; sin embargo, aunque el administrador haga muy bien su trabajo y por muchos años nunca se convertirá en dueño de eso que administra. Tú podrás creer que eres dueño de muchas cosas: una casa con todo sus contenidos, un coche, una computadora, un teléfono móvil, terrenos o propiedades, un negocio, acciones en una empresa y fondos de inversión colectivos. ¿De verdad es tuyo todo eso? Si así fuera, pudieras llevártelo todo cuando te mueras. El valor de cualquier cosa que “posees” tiene sólo el valor que otros le atribuyen. ¿Qué pasaría si empezaras a mirar las cosas no como algo que “posees” sino algo que “adminstras”? Piensa en las implicaciones que eso tendría. Si pensaras menos en que eres “dueño” y más en que eres “administrador” con una *corresponsabilidad* por lo que Dios te ha dado . . .

- ¿te aferrarías menos a las cosas?
- ¿te preguntarías más a menudo quién pudiera beneficiarse de “tus” cosas?
- ¿pensarías más en los demás antes que en ti?
- ¿considerarías cómo podrías beneficiar a las futuras generaciones?

Un cambio de actitud que piense menos como dueño y más como administrador y responsable pudiera parecer insignificante, pero si te lo propones y llegas a hacerte tal hábito puede cambiar tu manera de pensar, tus palabras y acciones de forma inesperada. Empieza por decirte: “Voy a tratar de ver todo lo que me pertenece no como *dueño* sino con una *corresponsabilidad* por lo que Dios me ha dado, ya sean mis cosas, mis relaciones, mis posibilidades”. El verdadero dueño y juez de todo es Dios. Es Dios quien saca a la luz aquello que está escondido y conoce las intenciones de tu corazón. Después de todo, ¿a quién le pertenece este mundo?
