FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

On Friday evening, September 14, the "Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross," we will have a Holy Hour beginning at 7:30pm in the Church. This will be a time for prayer and healing for all whose lives have been touched by the cross through abuse. We will continue to pray for healing for all in our Church whose faith has been shaken during this time of pain. The hour will include exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Benediction, Scripture and time for some quiet prayer. All are invited to join us.

Our Gospel this weekend relates the story of the healing by Jesus of a man who was deaf and mute. On the physical level this miracle transformed the man's life completely. He was able to hear and to speak plainly. On the spiritual level the Gospel reminds each of us that our ears must always be open to hear God's Word, to listen to it and to respond to it. Our mouths must be open so we may proclaim the Word to others. We pray that just as this man's life was transformed by the power of Lord's word, so may His word transform us!

Tuesday of this week is September 11, the 17th anniversary of the tragic events of that day. Let us remember all who died that day and all who responded so heroically to save others. We keep in mind all who are suffering illness today because of their presence there and all the families who still grieve the loss of a loved one. Pray for peace!
