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THOUGHTS FROM FR. DAVID LAWRENCE

The Ascension of Jesus is difficult to explain in a contemporary way. It suggests a spatial image of Jesus ascending to the heavens and leaving his disciples on earth ---an "up and down" dualistic kind of thing. Our education both academically and spiritually suggests the same. We think of good and bad, love and hate, generous and stingy, life and death. We might call this categorization Greek thinking, which emphasized dualism.

This kind of polarized "either/or" thinking is not all that conclusive when we ponder Ascension. While the risen Jesus in the body is visibly out of sight, glorified as the Christ, he remains in his body called the Body of Christ. He remains in Holy Eucharist and the other sacraments. He does this through his Spirit. Thus, Ascension and Pentecost are integrally bound. We might call this understanding Jewish thinking, a more cosmic integration of body and spirit.

When we examine our prayers, we get a better hint of this Jewish thinking. We say in our "Holy, holy" prayer, "heaven and earth are full of your glory."

In the Our Father, we pray "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." Father Barron in his book *Vibrant Paradoxes* (p.156) says "this is decidedly not a prayer that we might escape from the earth, but rather that earth and heaven might come together."

Fr. Barron continues: "The first Christians saw the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead as the commencement of the process by which earth and heaven were being reconciled. They appreciated the risen Christ as the heavenly ruler of the nations, the one who would bring the justice of heaven to this world."

The first disciples, Peter, Paul, Thomas, Andrew, John and the others went into the world to proclaim salvation with the title: "Jesus is Lord!" They would form commu-

nity, the Church, where the coming-together of earth and heaven happens. So we belong to a community of reconciling: sinners and saints, sin and mercy, the insiders and outsiders, those feeling blessed by God and those distant from God. St. Paul says that Christ reconciles heaven and earth.

Why do we belong to the Church? In a sense, to bring heaven and earth closer together. Our presence at mass in the community, our faith, our prayer, our participation, our outreach to the poor ---foster a harmony that brings heaven closer. The end result is joy. We can experience the happiness of God here on earth.

Mother's Day is this weekend. We honor our mothers as God's holy instruments of giving life, instilling love, creating family, setting each of us on a path for a fruitful life. Give a big hug, offer a prayer of gratitude for your mother and give a kind greeting to generous mothers raising their children!

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PENSAMIENTOS DEL PADRE DAVID LAWRENCE

La Ascensión de Jesús es difícil de explicar de una manera contemporánea. Sugiere una imagen especial de Jesús ascendiendo a los cielos



y dejando a sus discípulos en la tierra – un tipo de cosa dualista “arriba y abajo.” Nuestra educación tanto académica como espiritual sugiere lo mismo. Pensamos en lo bueno y lo malo, en el amor y el odio, en ser generosos y mezquinos, en la vida y la muerte. Podríamos llamar a esta categorización el pensamiento griego que enfatizaba el dualismo.

Este tipo de pensamiento de “uno u otro” no es concluyente cuando consideramos la Ascensión. Mientras el Jesús resucitado en el cuerpo está visiblemente fuera de la vista, glorificado como Cristo, permanece en su cuerpo llamado el Cuerpo de Cristo. El permanece en la Sagrada Eucaristía y los otros sacramentos. El hace esto a través de su Espíritu. Por lo tanto, la Ascensión y Pentecostés están unidos integralmente. Podríamos llamar a esto comprensión del pensamiento judío, una integración grandiosa de cuerpo y espíritu.

Cuando examinamos nuestras oraciones, obtenemos un mejor indicio de este pensamiento judío. Decimos en nuestra oración “Santo, Santo,” “el cielo y la tierra están llenos de su gloria.” En el Padrenuestro, oramos “Venga a nosotros tu reino, hágase tu voluntad, así en la tierra como en el cielo.” El Padre Barrón en su libro *Vibrant Paradoxes* (p.156) dice “esto definitivamente no es una oración de la que podamos escapar de la tierra, sino que la tierra y el cielo podrían unirse.”

El Padre Barrón continúa: “Los primeros cristianos vieron la Resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos como el comienzo del proceso por el cual la tierra y el cielo

se reconciliaban. Ellos apreciaron a Cristo resucitado como el gobernante celestial de las naciones, el que llevaría la justicia del cielo a este mundo.

Los primeros discípulos, Pedro, Pablo, Tomás, Andrés, Juan y los demás fueron al mundo a proclamar la salvación con el título: “¡Jesús es el Señor!”. Ellos formaron una comunidad, la Iglesia, donde se uniría la tierra y el cielo. Así que pertenecemos a una comunidad de reconciliación: pecadores y santos, pecado y misericordia, los de adentro y afuera, los que se sienten bendecidos por Dios y los que están lejos de Dios. San Pablo dice Cristo reconcilia el cielo y la tierra.

¿Por qué pertenecemos a la Iglesia? En cierto sentido, para unir el cielo y la tierra. Nuestra presencia en la misa, en la comunidad, nuestra fe, nuestra oración, nuestra participación, nuestro alcance a los pobres – fomentamos una armonía que nos acerque al cielo. El resultado final es alegría. Podemos experimentar la felicidad de Dios aquí en la tierra.

El día de la madre es este fin de semana. Honramos a nuestras madres como los santos instrumentos de Dios para dar vida, infundir amor, crear familia y poner a cada uno de nosotros en el camino de una vida fructífera. ¡Dale un gran abrazo, ofrécele una oración de gratitud a tu Madre y saluda cordialmente a las Madres generosas que crían a sus hijos!

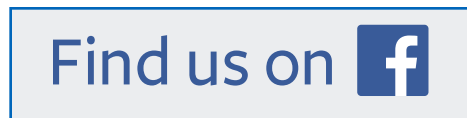
