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THOUGHTS FROM FR. MATHEW VELLANKAL



This weekend we continue to speak about the parts of the Mass. During the last two weekends, you heard homilies on Introductory Rites and the Liturgy of the Word. My homily this weekend will explore the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is the part of the Mass where the death and Resurrection of Jesus are made present again; our gifts of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus, which we receive in Holy Communion.

We start the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the Presentation of the Gifts and Preparation of the Altar. In gratitude to God, all of us participate in the offertory with our monetary offerings, which are the fruits of our labor. You will have noticed that we have now more people coming forward with the gifts. It is to engage the community and to have better participation because they are truly "our" gifts, the community's gifts of bread and wine. So please consider it as a true honor and privilege to be asked to bring up the gifts.

With the help of the head eucharistic minister and the altar servers, the presider prepares the altar and says the Prayer over the Offerings. Once that is done, we have the Eucharistic Prayer that starts with the Preface. It is a prayer of thanksgiving that usually names the reasons why the community praises God on a particular day.

There are different Eucharistic Prayers that we use at the Mass.

The Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In this prayer, the celebrant acts in the person of Christ as the head of his body, the Church. The priest offers the Eucharistic Prayer in the first-person plural, for example, "Therefore, O Lord, **we** humbly implore you..." This "we" signifies that all the baptized present at the Eucharistic celebration make the sacrificial offering in union with Christ. And what is most important, we do not offer Christ alone; we are called to *offer ourselves*, our lives, our individual efforts to grow

more like Christ and our efforts as a community of believers to spread God's Word and to serve God's people.

The *epiclesis*, in which, by means of particular invocation, the Church implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands be consecrated, that is, become Christ's Body and Blood.

The Institution narrative and Consecration, by which, by means of the words and action of Christ, that Sacrifice is effected which Christ himself instituted during the Last Supper. We usually kneel during the consecration, to acknowledge the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and to manifest our respect and reverence.

Other elements of the Eucharistic Prayers are the intercessions. We pray that the oblation is made for all the members of the Church, living and dead, who are called to participate in the redemption and salvation.

The Communion Rite follows the Eucharistic Prayer, leading the faithful to the Eucharistic table. The rite begins with the Lord's Prayer. Jesus taught this prayer to his disciples when they asked how to pray. Then we make peace with our sisters and brothers before we receive the Holy Communion. As you approach the Eucharistic Minister, please remember to bow with reverence. You may receive the Body of Christ either on the tongue or in the hand (open palm, one over the other). We stand here while receiving the Holy Communion and so please do not kneel. The Communion Rite ends with the Prayer after Communion which asks that the benefits of the Eucharist will remain active in our daily lives. St. Agustina exhorts: "If we receive the Eucharist worthily, we become what we receive."

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PENSAMIENTOS DEL PADRE MATHEW VELLANKAL

Este fin de semana continuamos hablando sobre las partes de la Misa. En los últimos dos fines de semana, escucharon



homilias sobre Ritos Introdutorios y la Liturgia de la Palabra. Mi homilía este fin de semana explorará la Liturgia de la Eucaristía. La Liturgia de la Eucaristía es la parte de la Misa donde la muerte y la Resurrección de Jesús se vuelven a hacer presentes; nuestros dones de pan y vino se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús, que recibimos en la Sagrada Comunión.

Comenzamos la Liturgia de la Eucaristía con la Presentación de los Regalos y la Preparación del Altar. En agradecimiento a Dios, todos nosotros participamos en el ofertorio con nuestras ofrendas monetarias que son el fruto de nuestro trabajo. Habrás notado que ahora tenemos más personas que presentan los regalos. Esto es para involucrar a la comunidad y tener una mejor participación de porque son verdaderamente "nuestros" regalos. El pan y vino son los regalos de la comunidad. Por lo tanto, considere que es un verdadero honor y privilegio que se le pida que presente los regalos.

Con la ayuda del Ministro Eucarístico Principal y los Servidores del Altar, el sacerdote prepara el altar y dice la Oración sobre las Ofrendas. Una vez hecho esto, tenemos la Oración Eucarística que comienza con el Prefacio. Es una oración de acción de gracias que generalmente nombra las razones por las cuales la comunidad alaba a Dios en un día en particular.

Hay diferentes oraciones eucarísticas que usamos en la misa. La oración eucarística es el corazón de la liturgia de la Eucaristía. En esta oración, el celebrante actúa en la persona de Cristo como la cabeza de su cuerpo, la Iglesia. El sacerdote

ofrece la oración eucarística en plural, por ejemplo, "Por lo tanto, oh Señor, nosotros te imploramos humildemente ..." Este "nosotros" significa que todos los bautizados presentes en la celebración eucarística hacen la ofrenda del sacrificio en unión con Cristo. Y lo que es más importante, no ofrecemos a Cristo solo; estamos llamados a ofrecernos a nosotros mismos, nuestras vidas, nuestros esfuerzos individuales para crecer más como Cristo y nuestros esfuerzos como una comunidad de creyentes para difundir la Palabra de Dios y servir al pueblo de Dios.

La epiclesis, en la que, por medio de una invocación particular, la Iglesia implora el poder del Espíritu Santo para que los dones ofrecidos por las manos humanas sean consagrados, es decir, se conviertan en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo.

La Institución narrativa y Consagración, mediante la cual, por medio de las palabras y la acción de Cristo, se realiza el sacrificio que Cristo mismo instituyó durante la Última Cena. Por lo general, nos arrodillamos durante la consagración reconociendo la presencia real de Cristo en la Eucaristía y manifestando nuestro respeto y reverencia.

Otro elemento de la Plegaria Eucarística son las intercesiones. Oramos para que el ofrecimiento se haga para todos los miembros de la Iglesia, vivos y muertos, que están llamados a participar en la redención y la salvación.

Al Rito de la Comunión le sigue la Oración Eucarística, guiando a los fieles a la mesa de la Eucaristía. El rito comienza con el Padrenuestro. Jesús enseñó esta oración a sus discípulos cuando le preguntaron cómo orar. Luego hacemos las paces con nuestras hermanas y hermanos antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión. Cuando se acerque al Ministro de la Eucaristía, recuerde inclinarse con reverencia. Puede recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en la lengua o en la mano (palma abierta, una sobre la otra). Permanecer de pie mientras recibimos la Sagrada Comunión, así que por favor no se arrodille. El Rito de la Comunión termina con la Oración después de la Comunión, que

pide que los beneficios de la Eucaristía se mantengan activos en nuestra vida diaria. Santa Agustina exhorta: "Si recibimos la Eucaristía dignamente, nos convertimos en lo que recibimos".
