



#### Pastoral Reflection

November 1 is All Saints Day, a day to remember all those faithful men and women who don't have their own day on the church calendar but who are with God in heaven. Who are the saints? Saints are simply people who pay attention with their whole mind, heart and soul, who pay attention to the presence of God in their heart and to God's presence in the lives of others at home, at school, at work, in the neighborhood, and the poor and vulnerable around the world.

Saints are people who pay attention to being honest and faithful, fair and just, loyal and trustworthy, pure and compassionate. Saints are people who pay attention to their own faults, who make amends for their sins and who forgive others. Saints are people who pay attention to the consequences of their habits, choices, decisions, spending and politics.

On this All Saints Day, let us thank you, Lord, for all the saints each of us has known in our own life.

I praise and thank you for those who loved me ... for those who raised me. for those who first told me of Jesus. for those who taught me so many things, for those who forgave me, for those who protected me, for those whose patience blessed me, for those who touched my soul, for those who healed my heart, for all who sacrificed for me ...

#### **VOICES THAT CHALLENGE: OPPOSE PHYSICIAN ASSISTED SUICIDE**

Last week the NJ General Assembly narrowly passed an assisted suicide bill, the Aid in Dying for the Terminally III Act (A2451). It now goes to the NJ Senate (S2474) and may be voted on soon at a meeting of the Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee. The NJ Catholic Bishops and NJ Right to Life have both asked that we contact our legislators asking them to Vote NO on this proposed legislation. Our Catholic faith tells us that human life is sacred "from conception to natural death." 


