Pastoral Reflection

APPRECIATING CREATION and BEING SHEPHERDS

'Some people, in order to discover God, read books. But, there is a great book: The very appearance of created things. Look above you! Look below you! Note it. Read it. God, whom you want to discover, never wrote that book with ink. Instead, he set before your eyes the things he has made. Can you ask for a louder voice than that?" (St. Augustine of Hippo)

Native Americans have a beautiful attitude toward creation, toward the world, toward people. They believe in the Great Spirit, the Great Spirit that fills all things and they are part of it all. So the lake is their sister, their brother-- the animals, the flowers, the trees, the sky, the stars, and the people. All are seen together. There is a wonderful feeling of being part of the whole creation—one person never has to feel alone or as an isolated fragment of something, but part of the wonder of all creation, of all people.

The unity of creation is also very much part of our Christian heritage. We believe that human beings are connected with all of creation. The heavens and the earth and all who dwell on the earth come from God's creative hand.

We have spent a lot of time in the course of our history focusing on the differences in creation—between planets and stars, between vegetation and minerals, between animals and humans. But, we should not ignore the fundamental unity of all creations—the wonderful work of God.

One of the favorite images in the Gospels is the Good Shepherd. Everybody is called to be a shepherd of this world. When I look at something as a part of me, and myself as a part of all people and all creation, it makes a difference. I tend to treat something that I am a part of differently than something that is not my own. The people of this earth are not strangers. They are my sisters and brothers. The earth is God's and all who dwell in it. We, like God whose Spirit is within us, are to care for and nurture the earth and all the people on this earth, like shepherds care for the flock.

If we look at this earth with a shepherd's eye, it will look different, and we will act differently. How? We will leave out or exclude no country, no group of people. We will care about cities, the earth and people. We are shepherds of God's creation, not strangers or marauders. We are God's daughters and sons. The Spirit of God is within us. The Lord is all creation and all the people in it. We are part of the wondrous creation, placed here by God to continue God's shepherding work.
