WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

FROM THE PASTOR'S NOTEBOOK:



My 6th grade teacher taught public school for most of her professional life. I had the pleasure of spending ten months of my life in her sixth grade class. I liked all my teachers from kindergarten (Clair Walsh) to the final days of my post graduate work at Seton Hall with Msgr. Robert Harrihan. There was always something positive to be said for all of these educators. But my 6th grade teacher was a most unique teacher in that her communication skills were far superior to any instructors prior to or thereafter. You see, when my 6th grade teacher had exhausted all methods of gaining your attention, she would simply pick up a piece of chalk from the blackboard rest and, with archer's accuracy, throw the chalk at the back of your head. Boy, that got your attention! Or, if she was in a kinder mood, she would throw the blackboard eraser! Oh, the good old days of reading and writing and felonious behavior!! She had a very loud and thunderous retort and at times could be heard throughout the entire building. Raising her voice was a daily – as well as terrifying – experience.

I was a good student, at least in terms of conduct; no chalk marks on the back of my head. I actually liked my sixth grade teacher. I understood her methods of discipline. I thought of her at my 25th anniversary reception. What on earth would make you think of her at such a joyous time, you say? Because, of all the things she taught me, the most valuable lesson was (and I quote) *"make sure the work you do in life is not just a job, but something you love to do"*. How many people spoke such kind words about my life and ministry, how I had helped them in the past with words or actions that I did not fully realize. How so many people commented on a "25 year commitment" that for me seemed to pass so quickly. I have loved, enjoyed and especially appreciated my priesthood, how it has allowed me the privilege to come to know all of you and to become part of your family. My sixth grade teacher may have had her moments, but in those moments were jewels of true wisdom.

God bless you, Mrs. B. And God bless all of you for your kindness to me.

IMPORTANT DIOCESAN INFORMATION RELEASE

Reverend and Dear Father,

It has come to our attention that a phone scam could be using the names of our parishes. The scam goes something like this: A caller begins with "I am calling from XXXXXX Church ... Can you hear me?" If you respond by saying "Yes" they record it and use this to verify you saying "yes" to placing an order for a product or service. The scam could be sophisticated enough so that the phone number for the parish appears on caller ID.

You may want to make your parishioners aware of this and suggest they not answer any questions over the phone, even the seemingly innocent "Can you hear me?" or any similar "yes" or "no" question unless the caller identifies herself/himself as a recognized employee or representative of the parish. When in doubt call the parish to confirm whether any calls are in fact being made on behalf of the parish.

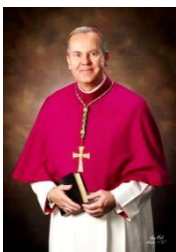

Bishop Joseph C. Bambera invites the faithful to join him on a special pilgrimage to Spain and Portugal in honor of the 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima's appearance to three young shepherd children in 1917. **The pilgrimage will take place September 18-26, 2017 and will include Masses celebrated by the Bishop and visits to many sacred and historic sites, including nearly two days in Fatima where the Marian apparitions occurred.**



The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared six times to the children – Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta – near the town of Fatima, Portugal between May 13 and October 13, 1917. During a time of war and turmoil, she told them that she had been sent by God with a message that Heaven would grant peace to all the world if her requests for prayer, reparation and consecration were heard and obeyed. NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A

MINOR: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Msgr. Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.

It signifies that you are being asked to live your life as an example and in imitation of God's love for the person you sponsor. To serve as a sponsor, it is required that a person obtain a sponsor letter from his/her pastor. Sponsors must be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Confirmation, (If married) be married according to the regulations for marriage as provided by the Roman Catholic Church, officially registered and participating weekly in the Sunday Eucharist & actively striving to live out your own baptismal commitment to Christ.
