COURSE CONTENT

Introduction to God's revelation of His Love throughout salvation history and the Catholic approach to Scripture. Topics covered will include: the relationship between Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, the role of the Magisterium in the interpretation of Scripture, inspiration, inerrancy, canonicity, the senses of Scripture, methods of Biblical interpretation, the centrality of the covenant, and a survey of the Old and New Testament. Emphasis will be placed on how to use and read the Bible within the tradition of the Catholic Church. You will use the Bible daily. Masses are a part of Theology.
