FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. **Happy Columbus Marathon!** If you're reading this, you successfully made it to church in spite of the Marathon that runs right past our place of worship! We pray for the safety of the runners and hope that it benefits our city in good and worthy ways.
2. **Priests' Convocation** – Every few years our Bishop summons the priests of the Diocese to come away with him to meet, look at some issues and items that affect our responsibilities as priests and pastors, and to spiritually recharge and renew acquaintances with him and one another. Please pray for your priests. The convocation goes from next Monday (October 26-29) and ends on Thursday. Since it is a command performance, Masses on Wednesday and Thursday are cancelled.
3. **Keep in Your Prayers** Mrs. Jan Silcott, mother of our school Principal, Mr. Jim Silcott who died on Friday of this past week. We join him and his family in prayer in this time of loss. I've known Jan for many years – she was a wonderful and faith-filled person who will be missed by family and friends.
4. **Canon Law Convention** – A very fruitful time for us canon lawyers! Of course, the new changes in the processes for investigating and granting declarations of invalidity (annulments) were discussed and explained. Virtually all of the Tribunals of our nation have gotten calls from people wanting "one of those 45 day annulments." However, the decision to take it to the "briefer process" is made not on the personal or parish level, but rather on the tribunal level. Plus, both parties to the former marriage must submit the petition together which will eliminate a lot of potential requests. Keep our tribunal in your prayers as we prepare to implement the new processes given to us by Pope Francis, to help speed up the processes so that the faithful can receive a more timely reply to their request for and investigation into the validity of their former marriages.
5. **Respect Life Month** – It is now a familiar tradition to focus our attention to a central teaching of Roman Catholic Social Doctrine: Respect for the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death. Pope Francis has warned us against putting any of these threats to the dignity of human life into a priority. All of them are attacks on human life, and all of them need to be highlighted and the effort to change hearts is incumbent on all of us. Information to this end is contained elsewhere in this bulletin. Let's remember to keep this intention in our prayer always.
6. **Second Collections:** October 17 and 18: World Mission Sunday; October 31, November 1st. Trinity School Tuition Assistance; November 21st and 22nd: Campaign for Human Development.
