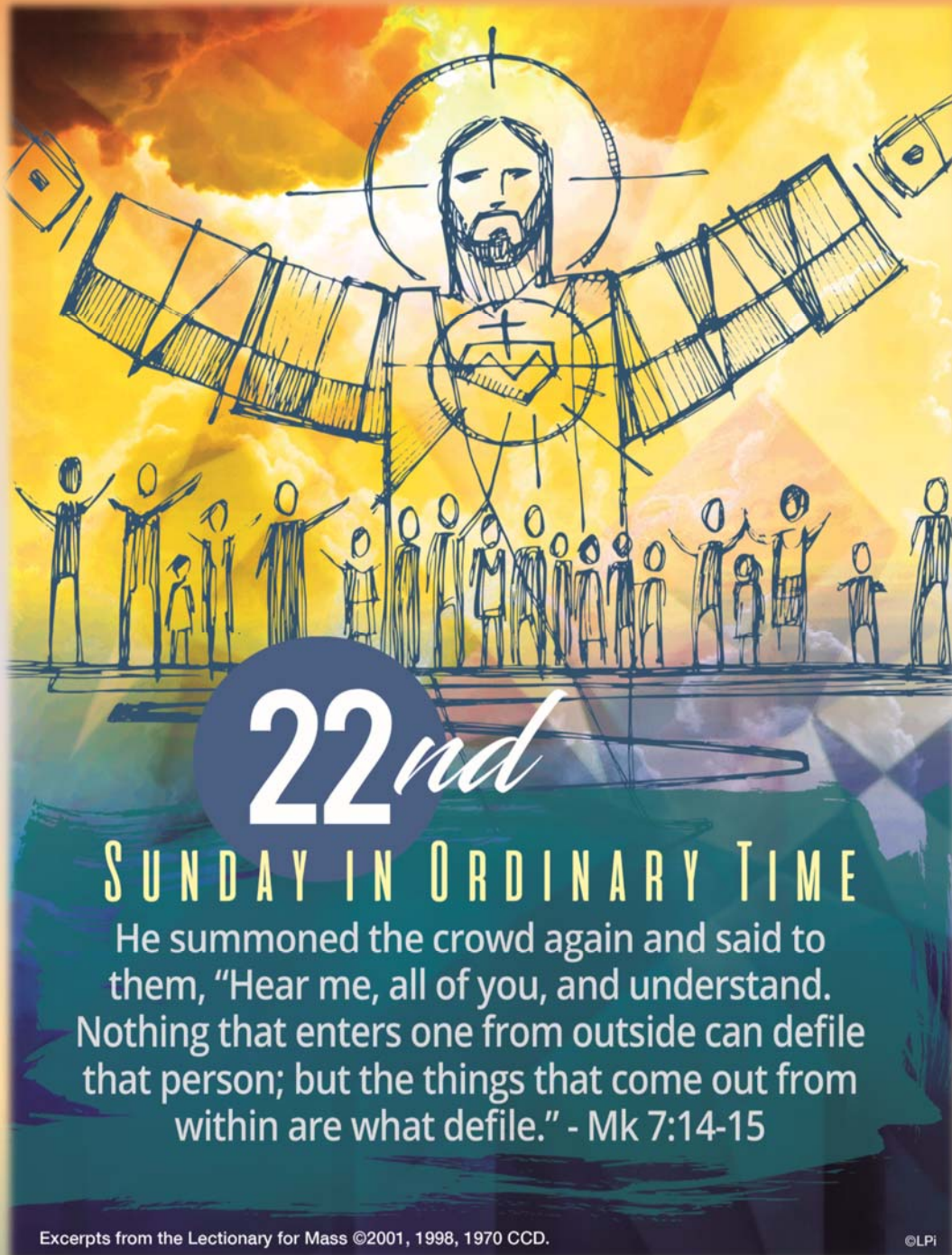

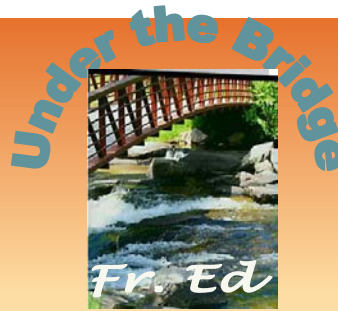


DAILY RECITATION OF THE ROSARY

ST. PAUL POLISH NATIONAL CATHOLIC CHURCH

Due to recent events, some parishioners have inquired as to what exactly is St. Paul Polish National Catholic Church in Bellevue. The Polish National Catholic Church is NOT in communion with the Roman Catholic Church. It is a separate Christian denomination. The *Handbook of Denominations in the United States* says the following regarding the Polish National Catholic Church of America:

A strictly American church born on American soil, this body was formally organized at Scranton, Pennsylvania, on March 14, 1897, after a long period of conflict between the Roman Catholic Church and many Polish immigrants. Roman Catholic in background, these adherents objected that in the U.S. they had no Polish bishops and few priests, they could not teach Polish in their parish schools, and . . . they had no right to establish parishes of their own.

Once again, that denomination is not in communion with the universal Church. (Also, *please* do not confuse that church with St. Paul Catholic Church and School in Leesburg!)

SAINT TERESA OF CALCUTTA
 SAINT OF THE DAY FOR SEPTEMBER 5
 (AUGUST 26, 1910 – SEPTEMBER 5, 1997)
 SAINT TERESA OF CALCUTTA'S STORY



Mother Teresa of Calcutta, the tiny woman recognized throughout the world for her work among the poorest of the poor, was beatified October 19, 2003. Among those present were hundreds of Missionaries of Charity, the order she founded in 1950, as a diocesan religious community. Today the congregation also includes contemplative sisters and brothers and an order of priests.

Born to Albanian parents in what is now Skopje, Macedonia, Gonxha (Agnes) Bojaxhiu was the youngest of the three children who survived. For a time, the family lived comfortably, and her father's construction business thrived. But life changed overnight following his unexpected death.

During her years in public school, Agnes participated in a Catholic sodality and showed a strong interest in the foreign missions. At age 18, she entered the Loreto Sisters of Dublin. It was 1928 when she said goodbye to her mother for the final time and made her way to a new land and a new life. The following year she was sent to the Loreto novitiate in Darjeeling, India. There she chose the name Teresa and prepared for a life of service. She was assigned to a high school for girls in Calcutta, where she taught history and geography to the daughters of the wealthy. But she could not escape the realities around her—the poverty, the suffering, the overwhelming numbers of destitute people.

In 1946, while riding a train to Darjeeling to make a retreat, Sister Teresa heard what she later explained as "a call within a call. The message was clear. I was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them." She also heard a call to give up her life with the Sisters of Loreto and instead, to "follow Christ into the slums to serve him among the poorest of the poor."

After receiving permission to leave Loreto, establish a new religious community, and undertake her new work, Sister Teresa took a nursing course for several months. She returned to Calcutta, where she lived in the slums and opened a school for poor children. Dressed in a white sari and sandals—the ordinary dress of an Indian woman—she soon began getting to know her neighbors—especially the poor and sick—and getting to know their needs through visits.

The work was exhausting, but she was not alone for long. Volunteers who came to join her in the work, some of them former students, became the core of the Missionaries of Charity. Others helped by donating food, clothing, supplies, and the use of buildings. In 1952, the city of Calcutta gave Mother Teresa a former hostel, which became a home for the dying and the destitute. As the order expanded, services were also offered to orphans, abandoned children, alcoholics, the aging, and street people.

For the next four decades, Mother Teresa worked tirelessly on behalf of the poor. Her love knew no bounds. Nor did her energy, as she crisscrossed the globe pleading for support and inviting others to see the face of Jesus in the poorest of the poor. In 1979, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. On September 5, 1997, God called her home. Blessed Teresa was canonized by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016.

REFLECTION

Mother Teresa's beatification, just over six years after her death, was part of an expedited process put into effect by Pope John Paul II. Like so many others around the world, he found her love for the Eucharist, for prayer, and for the poor a model for all to emulate.

REFLECTION

God calls us to be perfect as he is. This is the universal call to holiness. The ancient Greeks measured perfection by using a physical standard like the Olympics or mental standard like perfection of wisdom. Ancient Hebrews viewed perfection as coming closer to God. The closer we are to God, the closer we are to what wants us to be. We have the model of perfection in our canonized saints. Are you one of those saints that is recognized only by God? God gave us the means to achieve a closer union to him through the Sacraments and simply asking him. Continue to ask God for this.

THE BEATITUDES

Pope Francis, Shepherd of Truth

Notable quotations from Pope Francis and official teachings of the Roman Catholic Church

MOST ENLIGHTENING

Nothing is more enlightening than turning to Jesus' words and seeing His way of teaching the truth. Jesus explained with great simplicity what it means to be holy when He gave us the Beatitudes (cf. Mt 5:3-12; Lk. 6:20-23). (63)



IDENTITY CARD

The Beatitudes are like a Christian's identity card. So if anyone asks: "What must one do to be a good Christian?", the answer is clear. We have to do, each in our own way, what Jesus told us in the Sermon on the Mount... In the Beatitudes, we find a portrait of the Master, which we are called to reflect in our daily lives. (63)

"TRUE HAPPINESS"

The word "happy" or "blessed" thus becomes a synonym for "holy". It expresses the fact that those faithful to God and His word, by their self-giving gain true happiness. (64)

THE POWER OF THE SPIRIT

The Beatitudes are in no way trite or undemanding, quite the opposite... We can only practice them if the Holy Spirit fills us with His power and frees us from our weakness, our selfishness, our complacency and our pride. (65)

LISTEN TO JESUS

Let us listen once more to Jesus, with all the love and respect that the Master deserves. Let us allow His words to unsettle us, to challenge us and to demand a real change in the way we live. Otherwise, holiness will remain no more than an empty word. (66)

THE WORKS OF MERCY

Those who really wish to give glory to God by their lives, who truly long to grow in holiness, are called to be single-minded and tenacious in their practice of the works of mercy. (107)

A SIMPLE LIFE

... We will find it hard to feel and show any real concern for those in need, unless we are able to cultivate a certain simplicity of life, resisting the feverish demands of a consumer society, which leaves us impoverished and unsatisfied, anxious to have it all now... When we allow ourselves to be caught up in superficial information, instant communication and virtual reality, we can waste precious time and become indifferent to the suffering flesh of our brothers and sisters. Yet even amid this whirlwind of activity, the Gospel continues to resound, offering us the promise of a different life, a healthier and happier life. (108)

"POWERFUL WITNESS"

The powerful witness of the saints is revealed in their lives, shaped by the Beatitudes and the criterion of the final judgment. Jesus' words are few and straightforward, yet practical and valid for everyone... I recommend rereading these great biblical texts frequently, referring back to them, praying with them, trying to embody them. They will benefit us; they will make us genuinely happy. (109)
