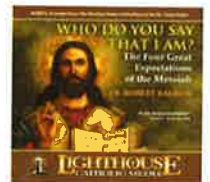

We have had a wonderful year of academic achievement, musical and artistic growth, and the daily celebration of God's love. I am proud of the hard work and dedication of our teachers and support staff. This Annual Report is an updated report of the report I shared at the Annual Board of Directors Meeting in April. It was requested that I share it with all of you. I think it is a wonderful way to see how your investment in Catholic education is at work.

supporting me in my interim position this year. The teamwork of the faculty, lunch, maintenance, and office staff has been instrumental in our having a very smooth transition year. I would especially like to thank Amy Alberts, Sigrid Weber, and Tina Stawicki. These three wonderful women in the St. John Bosco School Office have kept me on track and on top of things. I have been blessed to have worked with them and all the staff at St. John Bosco this year.

I will be returning next year as school secretary and administrative assistant to Mrs. Vickie Dassler, our new principal. Mrs. Dassler brings years of administrative leadership to our school and a strong commitment to strengthening our literacy development program. I look forward to working with Mrs. Dassler to grow our curriculum at St. John Bosco.

### Faith Formation

Each year we work on a service project in which students of all ages can participate. This year we again chose to "adopt" the different senior living homes in our area. Classes joined together to adopt different places and do something special for them each month. They have made cards, placemats, sent letters, and/or visited the residents. It has been a mutually fulfilling experience and one our students enjoy.

During Advent we had a special project to support the mission of the Christ Child Society. Students collected baby supplies and clothes and presented them to the Christ Child Society at the special shower of love Mass in December.



In addition to our weekly liturgies, we have given the students a variety of prayer experiences including a special prayer service to celebrate the life of Fr. Robert Konkell, The Living Rosary, Advent prayer services, the Divine Mercy chaplet, Stations of the Cross, and weekly Lenten services. We also provided reconciliation during Advent and Lent.

We have continued to expand student participation in the liturgy with our cantors and musicians who support the congregation at Mass.

The teachers have completed three of the Diocesan required Religious Education Certification programs. We have been scheduling these for once a year with a planned completion/certification by 2018.

We have continued the practice of starting each day with the faculty gathering for prayer before the students arrive. We use this time to pray for our students, special needs, or world situations.

## Personnel

Kathy Hartl, administrative assistant for the past seven years at St. John Bosco, served as interim administrator for the 2014-2015 school year. Vickie Dassler will begin her tenure as St. John Bosco Principal on July 1, 2015.

The administrator attended new administrator training monthly with the Diocese of Green Bay Education Office. She also attended regional monthly Diocesan Administrator meetings.

The administrator met with the Board President and Parish Priests twice a month to address needs and concerns of the school. In the event of incidents that came up between meetings, the Board President and Priests were apprised via email and consulted.

This year Mrs. Kate Taylor moved from Art to the position of 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher where she could focus her skills on teaching elementary education and the introduction of the Sacraments of 1<sup>st</sup> Communion and Reconciliation. We hired Mr. Jared Nellis to teach Art and Physical Education. Mrs. Monica Hilbert was hired to teach Middle School. Mrs. Karen Shaw was hired to teach 4K. Mrs. Marcia Egeland resigned her position as Technology Teacher, December 23, 2014 due to health concerns following a heart attack.



Mary Lou Schroeder was hired as a long term sub for the technology position in January 2015. Ken VanStratten, maintenance and janitorial staff, retired after 17 years of service in January. Mike Allen was hired to take over the maintenance/janitorial position that is shared with Corpus Christi Parish.



All faculty provided the administrator with a yearlong curriculum plan and set of goals in August. Lesson plans are handed in weekly to keep the administrator apprised of the process through the plan. All newsletters sent home by the faculty are copied to the administrator to make sure that consistent information is being shared to parents. Faculty includes the administrator in email correspondence to parents.

Due to the status of the interim administrator,

annual evaluation meetings will be a self-evaluation by the faculty member and goal review meeting with the interim administrator.

The faculty meets for regular staff meetings every other Tuesday during the school year. This year our Staff Development has included:

Faith Integration and Curriculum Development

## Curriculum

At our GALA for Giving celebration, we raised almost \$24,000 to use toward a new reading program during our Electric Moment (with a matching gift by Dennis and Bonnie Connolly). Vickie Dassler is working with the faculty to select a new reading/language arts program and implement a new Literacy and assessment program.

We have been working on implementing the diocesan curriculum and adapting to the new changes. The Diocese is working on completing the updated standards and benchmarks and hope to have them complete by 2016.

This year we have continued to offer Spanish to our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. Our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will enter high school with a solid foundation to begin the high school Spanish curriculum.

We continue to offer 4K-8 Music, 5-8 Band and band lessons, 5-8 Theater Arts, 4K-8 Physical Education, 5K-8 Art, and 4K-8 Computer Instruction.

We continue to use MAP testing to assess student academic growth in reading, language arts, math and science. We use the ACRE test to assess faith knowledge in grades 5 and 8.



## Technology

Our wireless system hub upgrade is complete. The new access points have allowed a greater accessibility for our 20 mobile student laptops and staff laptops.

All MAP assessment testing is cloud based this year which allows for quicker results/reports, easier set up, and advanced support.

We updated the student laptops with a lockdown browser to allow our MAP assessment testing to be done within individual classrooms, not just the computer lab. This allows us a much more flexible testing schedule.

**Finances**

Tuition assistance was distributed to 20 families this year totaling \$36,506.00. The applications are processed through the FACTS Grant and Aid Assistance Program. This 3<sup>rd</sup> party system allows for confidential unbiased recommendations for financial aid. Applications are completed on line through FACTS. FACTS then sends the administrator a financial needs assessment and allocation recommendation.

St. John Bosco received a very generous gift from the estate of Carol Coryell. The Carol Coryell Endowment Fund for St. John Bosco Catholic School has been established. This fund will provide a 5% annual gift to the tuition assistance fund of St. John Bosco. Distribution of this gift will take place in April each year. The first distribution of \$17, 286.32 was received in March this year.

Our fundraising projects are continuing to grow our income. Our Parent Association has continued to expand and renew our regular fundraising projects to keep them productive. This year our fundraising projects included:

St. John Bosco 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Golf Outing at Horseshoe Bay Golf Club generated \$15,000. We are looking forward to growing this annual event.

Each year we apply for E-Rate Discounts on phones, internet, and website services which are part of a Federal grant application. This year we received \$1,391.00 as a result of our application.

Our FACTS tuition and tuition aid management programs are continuing to keep our accounts current. For the past two years we have had no unpaid tuition accounts.

Our Annual Fund Drive is continuing to be successful! This year to date we have raised \$60,414.83, achieving our \$60,000 goal. This \$60,000 is a part of our budgeted income for the year. Our parish friends and families have been very supportive of this drive which helps us to keep our tuition affordable.



This year we have raised over \$12,000 through donations to our "Wish List". These donations will cover new book cases, musical instruments, transportation for fieldtrips, air conditioning for the



library/media center, our new reading program, and \$2000.00 for our trip to Camp U-Nah-Li-Ya to name a few. The wish list is published in the Parish Connection Newsletter.

The Diocese has charged us to work toward a three year rolling budget. The Board President has been working with the parishes to establish three year commitments to the school which will help allow us to make curriculum and staffing plans for the future.

## **Marketing**

Our Marketing committee has been working hard to develop new ways to help our community know about St. John Bosco. The committee recommended weekly announcements in the parishes. The St. John Bosco Office staff has written weekly announcements for all the parishes in Door County. We have had excellent response to these announcements. Parishioners have shared that they like hearing what is going on at the school.

Our cinema movie ad continues to run.

We are continuing our Parish Connection publication. We publish every 5 weeks. Response has been very positive.

We have implemented our new Baptismal Gift program. Each baptized child in a Door County parish will receive a voucher for \$250 toward their first year's Catholic school tuition. We hope this will help our young families to begin early to consider making a Catholic education a gift to their children.

The development of an Alumni Contact Program is being revisited.

Parent Association plans and implement events that fundraise, but also advertise and get the "word" out about St. John Bosco. Inviting our parish communities and our local communities to events like the Pumpkin Pizazz, Catholic Schools Week Family Movie, and the Gala of Giving share the community of St. John Bosco.

## **Extra Curricular**



This year we had three basketball teams: 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> grade girls, 4<sup>th</sup> grade boys, and 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grade boys. Many of our students also participated on the Sturgeon Bay teams since we didn't have enough students to field a team.

We produced our fourth annual school musical, Beauty and the Beast. This has become one of our favorite activities and our students in grades 4-8 are always excited about the production. The entire cast and crew did an amazing job bringing the audience to a quiet village and a magical castle in France. Each year our audience is growing as the word gets out about our professional performances.



## **Facilities**

We will be adding air conditioning to the Library/Media Center due to a generous donation from our Wish List.

The whiteboards that were donated last year were all installed over the summer.

## **Challenges for the Future**

Continue our updating of educational materials for the students to correlate with the Curriculum standards and to maintain a competitive education experience in the community.

Continue expanding our access to technology and training for teachers and students. We need new computers in our computer lab.

Continue development of an active alumni program. Maintaining an educationally sound, fiscally responsible program by doing some long term fiscal studies with the parishes and school families.

Continue to share the good news of St. John Bosco with our county parishes so that we are growing our Catholic faith by growing our Catholic school.
