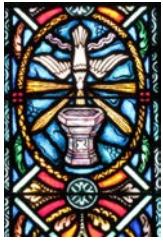

2019 MASS INTENTIONS

LOW GLUTEN HOSTS

In my previous Parishes, there was a need for low gluten hosts. Many people are diagnosed with celiac while others are encouraged to severely limit their intake of wheat germ. For these folks receiving a low gluten host can be of great benefit. All we do is hold a small container of low gluten hosts along with the usual paten for hosts, and the person can just point to the low gluten hosts to receive from that paten. This would be available on the celebrant's line. Please let me know if anyone would like this option, and we will initiate it.

Then before returning home, we visit Kaaterskill Falls- the highest falls in New York- yes, higher than Niagara- but much smaller volume of water.
