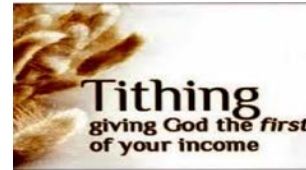

Columbus Day Hike with the Pastor

Msgr. Desmond invites families and teens of all ages to a Columbus Day Hike something he has done for the past 30 years. We would leave after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and travel to North-South Lake State Park in Haines Falls. After arriving we would walk to the site of the former Catskill Mountain House, a vacation spot for several Presidents and then have lunch. Pastor cooks hot dogs for those there, but bring your own snacks and drinks. After lunch, those up to it can hike to North Point seeing along the way many spots known for the Catskill Artists School. Hike can take up to three hours depending on everyone's ability. Many opt out of this and take a leisurely walk around the 2 lakes. Then before returning home, we visit Kaaterskill Falls- the highest falls in New York- yes, higher than Niagara- but much smaller volume of water.
