A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

It is that time of year, or at least very close to that time of the year, when the words, "at the lake," become as common as summer evening mosquitos. Spokane seems especially rich in "at the lake" opportunities, so much so that most people don't even bother to identify which lake they may have in mind when they say things like, "Well, Father, we won't be seeing you for a while; we'll be out at the lake." If pressed, they will happily let you know that they have a little cabin out on Newman, ("been in the family for years!"), or maybe a bigger place out on Priest, (kind of a drive, but once we're there, *its another world!*)

'tis a blessing, this season of lake-going. Locking up the house, packing the car with loads of groceries, and getting out of town for a week or two of peace and quiet, rest and relaxation, burgers and potato salad, *out at the lake* is one of life's great pleasures for those of us who call Spokane home.

Back when I was a kid, our cousins and our family shared a cabin on Lower Twin. It even had a name: *Pinecrest*, and was about the coolest place on earth, at least in summer. We and our cousins would alternate weeks; as our week drew close, we could hardly wait to kick of our city clothes and go all swimsuity for a full seven days (except for Sunday morning Mass in Rathdrum). We had an old cedar log that had been sawn in half and that was our best water toy: as we floated and paddled around on it, it could be a sub, a destroyer, an airplane, a rocketship...whatever our imaginations wanted it to be. Our wood dock was the place to dry off once our skin had turned pruney from too much swimming. You could read there, too, or if the previous school year had not gone so well, lay under the sun *trying* to memorize multiplication tables. At the end of the day following dinner, the volleyball came out and we'd choose up teams including Mom and Dad, and play until it was so dark we couldn't see the ball anymore. Sometimes, we'd escape "Lane Four", the dirt road where our cabin was located, and wander off into the woods to explore, practicing all the while the skills involved in being intrepid, (whatever intrepid meant).

Sunday evening was pack up and head for home time. Back to the world of pants and shoes and nothing to do at least until our seven-day urban purgatory was over and we loaded up the '55 Merc station wagon with all thirteen of us, not counting dogs (and the occasional cat), for another week "out at the lake."

No need here to go into the forest fire that may or may not have been caused by my brothers while exploring the old garbage dump beyond the highway...



Enjoy your lake as we enjoyed ours. Rest. Eat. Swim. Paddle. Be family. Love one another.
