Fifth Sunday of Easter April 29, 2018

First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

Saul, soon to be "Paul," comes to Jerusalem only to be confronted by angry traditionalist believers. It seems that peace came to the Palestinian churches with Saul, the former persecutor, gone.

Second Reading: I John 3:18-24

God, being "greater than our hearts," knows our inmost selves. We can have confidence in His mercy by keeping His commandments, believing in Jesus while we practice love of one another.

Gospel: John 15:1-8

We learned from the Good Shepherd symbol last week that God would prevent any of Jesus' sheep from being lost. Here Jesus as the Vine and we as the branches teaches us the importance of being connected to Christ.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Some years ago I had the pleasure of visiting the Napa Valley wine country in California. I was impressed by great fields of grapevines silently working under the sun to produce the grapes that would eventually reach dining tables everywhere as wine. I also had a lot of fun visiting the different wineries where I could taste a sample or two. You can imagine how in a short time such visits would make life look a little rosier!

I learned some things about wine along the way. How to savor a glass of it as a real food, and not just a thirst quencher. What wine would be best with what meal. The process by which grapes become wine.

I returned to California two years ago for my godson/nephew's wedding. There, on a bright early September afternoon, the reception was held in a tent set up near the office of a vineyard. Outside the temporary dining area were field after field of grapevines that eventually climbed up a nearby hill.

It dawned on me as I thought of that happy day how at one time long ago divine eyes also looked out at a vineyard. Jesus saw with His masterful perception that this would be a powerful teaching symbol to teach people about His deep connection to them. That He is the vine and they are the branches. What a touching design to make our relationship

with God an intertwining of His life with ours and our lives with His! Still true today. True, some of the mystery remains about how this is, but a comforting beauty also emerges from that symbol.

Some questions arise. If we really are so privileged to be connected with God, why is it that we sometimes want to pull away? Could it be that we find the relationship smothering? A diminishment of our freedom? Or is it that we shrink from His brotherly embrace because of how we have lived? "If He only knew!" we think, forgetting that He knows everything.

These are the kind of questions we each have to ask ourselves in the light of the Vine and branches metaphor. We also know that we can endure almost anything if we get an occasional hug and a smile from somebody we love. We don't need rose-colored glasses to maintain our optimism, born of the confidence that the Lord gives us. It's a wonderful feeling having Him beside us!

Just for that we can be so grateful that we can sing an "Alleluia" with full voice! That is a wonderful thing to think about on this late April Sunday. Life is good indeed, and the good news of Jesus the Vine and we the branches make life worth living. After all, while medical science is adding years to our lives, it's up to us to add life to our years!
